Mozambique without
any address by the
late M^r Burrup.
They belonged to D^r
Kirk and they were
entrusted to M^r Rae

by him at Quillimane
he had neglected to do
so & M^r Burrup
finding them after
wards at Mosambique
sent them off some
where
After communicating
with the Admiralty
I think you had
better send it to the
"Royal Botanic
Gardens" Kew
London
and I shall write

to have it identified
Address it please to
D^r J. D. Hooker, there.
By attending to this
you will much
oblige. Yours ever
David Livingstone
I think I told you
that I am going
out again as soon

as this book is out

Did you hear of any
other boxes belong to
the expedition?
